Becky's leadership ability was certainly a valued trait when she was declared Library Director after her predecessor left the position unexpectedly ... oh, by the way, and in the midst of a \$13 million expansion and renovation project! She was involved in public surveys, meetings, and complete oversight of the 18 month expansion, working closely with the City Council, the Renovation Committee, Library Board, Board of Trustees and the Friends of the Library. Additionally, during this time, our library remained committed to serving its patrons by opening a satellite location inside the Meriden Mall. Under Becky's leadership, attendance at the library has expanded as the number and diversity of programming has increased. Throughout her career, she's worked in collaboration with other city departments and other organizations including the Midstate Chamber of Commerce, Meriden Board of Education, the Meriden Historical Society and many others, including our local service clubs.


#### SPECIAL RECOGNITION - "COMMUNITY CHAMPION" AWARDS


